

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS (Part 2)

The Nutley War Memorial Hall holds a **Premises Licence** under the Licensing Act 2003 for the following licensable activities: DANCE, LIVE MUSIC, RECORDED MUSIC, PLAY. The Licence covers the Main Hall, the Conference Room and the Miller Room.

The Hall holds a **Music Licence** from the Performing Right Society Ltd. covering copyright music, and such music can be played in the Hall without further charge. However, if tapes, discs, CDs or videos are used as a music source the Hirer must also hold a licence from Phonographic Performance Ltd.

Conditions imposed by the **Premises Licence** include the following:

At least TWENTY-ONE DAYS' NOTICE shall be given to the Licensing Authority, the Chief Fire Officer and the Chief Officer of Police prior to the presentation of any STAGE PERFORMANCE, OR ANY SPECIAL ENTERTAINMENT FOR CHILDREN wholly or mainly under the age of 16 years.

The Licence forbids any exhibition, demonstration or performance of HYPNOTISM, MESMERISM or similar act or process.

Any ACCIDENT causing injury to person or property while a licensable activity is taking place must be reported to the Licensing Authority within 48 hours.

NOISE shall not be emitted from the licensed premises such as to cause persons in the neighbourhood to be unreasonably disturbed, and persons arriving at or leaving the premises must conduct themselves in an orderly manner.

The War Memorial Hall is NOT LICENSED FOR THE SALE OF ALCOHOL. Any person or organisation wishing to sell alcohol on the premises must apply to the Licensing Authority for a TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE (T E N). The following is a direct quotation from the T E N guidance notes:

Sale of Alcohol includes events where alcohol is included in the ticket price or no specific price is quoted per drink but “donations” are requested or accepted in respect of alcohol. Only if the alcohol is given completely free of charge is a licence not required.
